In our Sept. prayer letter I shared with you a little about my journey of questioning; who did God shape me to be? What was it that God had really called me to do? How would that fit into the needs of the ministry? Trying to answer these caused me to do something that Bertrand Russel once said; it was "a healthy thing now and then to hang a question mark on things you have long taken for granted." I realized that if I wanted to be successful, to get to the top I would have to question everything about who I am, and be willing to accept the good and the bad, and there was plenty of bad.

While I have not "arrived" and have it all together now, I am pleased with where I am, and the clarity that God has given me about who He has shaped me to be through my life experiences, people who have come and gone, people who are still a part of my life, and the different environments I have found myself in over the course of my life. God has shaped me to fulfill a role in this ministry that has needed some direction for quite some time.

As of Nov. 1st I have been serving in our Leadership Development and Human Resources department, as a Human Resources Specialist for "Sending". I am the Sending Associate for the Sport T.E.A.M. department, which is the same department in which Debbie & I have been serving. Our department is working hard to do our part of helping reach AIA's strategic objective of bringing on 250 new staff by July of 2017. From a human perspective, this is seemingly impossible. However, with God all things are possible.

What is "Sending"? It is the third part of AIA's and Cru's evangelistic model; "Win, Build, Send". The focus is not to recruit new staff; it is to send them out to be lifelong laborers and leaders for Christ. Naturally our hope is that some will serve with AIA, but more importantly we hope they use their gifts and talents to win others to Christ, and build them up in their faith regardless of their vocation.

I am excited about this next phase of my journey. I am enjoying serving in a role that guides people through the process of discerning what God is calling them to do. Jesus told us in Luke 10:2: "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore beseech the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into His harvest." Ministry does not happen without those who will labor. I am grateful for you laboring with us through your prayers and giving. Debbie and I could not do what we do without you!


Win, Build, SEND... Puerto Rican Style
